| Abasement | To submit passively to external forces, to accept injury, blame, etc |
| Achievement | To accomplish something difficult. To master, manipulate, or organize physical objects, human beings, or ideas |

| Aggression | To overcome opposition forcefully. To fight. To revenge |
| Autonomy | To get free, shake off restraint, break out of confinement |
| Counteraction | To master or make up for a failure by restriving. To over come weakness |
| Defendance | To defend the self against assault, criticism, and blame |
| Deference | To admire and support a superior. To praise, honor, or eulogize. |
| Dominance | To control one's human environment. To influence. |
| Harm Avoidance | To avoid pain, physical injury, illness, and death. |
| Infavoidance | To avoid humiliation. To quit embarrassing situations |
| Nurturance | To give sympathy and gratify the needs of a helpless object; an infant or any object that is weak. |
| Order | To put things in order. To achieve cleanliness, arragement |
| Play | To act for "fun" without further purpose. To like to laugh |
| Rejection | To separate oneself from a negatively cathected object. |
| Sentience | To seek and enjoy senuous impressions |
| Sex | To form and further an erotic relationships |
| Succorance | To have one's needs grafified by the sympathetic aid of an allied object |
